Mona Vale Hospital Urgent Care Centre



Palliative care and geriatric evaluation and management units



Mona Vale Hospital’s role will transform into a high-level rehabilitation and sub-acute hospital where more than 250 staff will deliver in-patient rehabilitation and aged healthcare services, along with palliative care, community health and an Urgent Care Centre - for the treatment of minor injuries and illnesses.

The Urgent Care Centre will be a free walk-in service open 24/7 and staffed by current Monna Vale Hospital Emergency Department clinicians. Patients needing more complex care will be looked after and safely transferred to the new Northern Beaches Hospital.

New specialist services will also be provided on the Monna Vale Hospital site with the construction of a dedicated 10-bed aged

care unit and a 10-bed Palliative Care Unit – which has never been available in this way on the Northern Beaches.

The new Northern Beaches Hospital will enable patients with serious medical conditions, previously taken by ambulance to Royal North Shore Hospital, to receive healthcare at the new, closer hospital.

More health services closer to home at the new hospital

Northern Beaches residents will be able to receive more specialised healthcare closer to home as the new hospital will have the latest imaging and diagnostic equipment, such as MRI, and high-level pathology.

It will have almost twice the number of emergency and intensive care beds and three times the number of

operating theatres than both Manly and Monna Vale Hospitals combined.

Bringing the acute services of the two hospitals together at the new hospital means the staff will be able to perform more complex major surgical procedures and treat sicker patients closer to home than possible before.

Babies born prematurely at 32 weeks will have access to high-level maternity care and a special care nursery and the community will have access to interventional cardiology services to diagnose and treat heart conditions.

None of these services have previously been provided at Manly or Monna Vale Hospitals and there is the ability to add further healthcare services into the future.

Mona Vale Hospital will remain in public ownership and the new services and infrastructure are part of the largest investment in healthcare on the Northern Beaches in decades.
