# Early Gross Motor Development

## Birth to 3 months

#### I am looking at you

During a cuddle:

- I can hold my head and look over your shoulder
- I am turning to look in both directions

#### On my back:

- · I turn my head to both sides
- I kick both legs and move both arms equally
- I am starting to use my hands and can pat or reach for a dangling toy

#### On my tummy:

- I can lift my head and turn to look both sides
- I like spending more time on my tummy







### 3 to 6 months

#### I am smiling lots

During a cuddle:

- I am looking around
- I hold my head up strongly

#### On my tummy:

- I play for longer
- I can push up on my hands with my arms straight
- Or prop on my elbows and reach for toys

#### On my back:

- I am playing with my feet
- I roll back and forth in both directions

#### On your lap or on the floor:

- I am starting to sit
- I can reach and grasp toys







# 6 to 9 months

# I am interested in new people and places

- · I can sit by myself
- I can reach and play with toys, and can transfer hand to hand
- I can push up on my tummy
- I can move on the floor and pivot on my tummy
- I can stand with support





# 9 to 12 months

#### I am moving a lot

- I like to explore
- I can crawl on my hands and knees
- I can kneel to play
- I am starting to pull to stand
- I can walk around furniture or with my hands held





### 12 to 18 months

# I am becoming independent

- · I am pulling to stand
- I am standing to play
- I am walking sideways along a support/table
- I am walking with my hands held
- · I am walking by myself
- I am crawling up steps
- · I may walk up steps
- I maybe starting to run
