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# **NSLHD Overall Performance**

Northern Sydney Local Health District (NSLHD) remains at Performance Level 0 – 'No Performance Issues'.

This is the highest Performance Level attainable, in accordance with the NSW Health Performance Framework.

# Patient Flow and Access

#### **Overall Performance (January 2023)**

In January 2023, there were 19,290 presentations to NSLHD Emergency Departments, an increase of 9% (17,586 presentations) when compared to January 2022.

Emergency Treatment Performance (ETP) for NSLHD was 64% in January 2023 against the overall target of 81%. This demonstrates an increase of 3% when compared to January 2022 (61%).

Overall Transfer of Care (ToC) for NSLHD was 93% in January 2023 against the target of 90%.

NSLHD had 737 patients overdue for elective surgery as at the end of January 2023.

## **Financial Performance**

#### **General Fund**

#### Overview

In February 2023, NSLHD recorded a Net Cost of Service (NCOS) of \$2.7M (1.9%) favourable, and 9.9M (-0.87%) unfavourable year to date. This includes the incremental costs related to the COVID-19 response.

After adjusting for the impact of the COVID-19 response, NSLHD recorded a NCOS of \$1.5M favourable for February 2023 and \$3.3M (-0.3%) unfavourable year to date. NSLHD and each Hospital and Service are working collaboratively on Efficiency Improvement Plans (EIPs) to ensure financial stability.

#### Total Expenses

In February 2023, NSLHD recorded \$1.5M (0.11%) favourable year to date after adjusting for the impact of COVID-19.

Overall year to date COVID-19 expenses is \$34.6M, which is composed of COVID-19 clinics, testing, vaccinations, and outsourced patient services activities.

#### Revenue

In February 2023, NSLHD recorded \$3.8M (-1.9%) unfavourable year to date.

\$5.5M of revenue Efficiency Improvement Plans have been submitted with more being developed to improve our revenue position.

#### Other item/s

As at February 2023, the NSLHD general fund bank account balance was \$3.564M.

# **Clinical Care and Improvement**

# Clinical Governance and Patient Experience

#### NSW State-wide Voluntary Assisted Dying Care Navigator and Pharmacy Services

NSLHD will host the NSW State-wide Voluntary Assisted Dying *Care Navigator* and *Pharmacy* Services which will both be operational by 28 November 2023. The Director of Clinical Governance and Patient Experience NSLHD is leading the design and establishment of these services in collaboration with the Ministry's Voluntary Assisted Dying Implementation Team.

#### Safety and Quality Essentials Pathway

The inaugural NSLHD Applied Safety and Quality Program commenced in February 2023. There are 17 multidisciplinary staff participating in the 12-month program to develop their capability to lead and enhance safety, quality, and person-centred care. Participants will lead a quality improvement project aligning with the NSLHD Strategic Plan 2022 – 2027 as part of the program.

#### Real Time Patient Experience Survey (RTPES)

The Clinical Governance and Patient Experience Unit are currently focusing on increasing the RTPES response rate from 25% to 30% by June 2023. Strategies to increase the response rate include patient education resources and supporting staff to raise awareness of the survey to consumers.

#### **District Drug and Therapeutic Committee and NSW Formulary**

In February 2023, the inaugural NSLHD District Drug and Therapeutic Committee (DTC) was convened, with over 40 specialised clinicians across NSLHD in attendance.

Professor Sarah Hilmer was appointed as the Chair, and Ms Jenny Crane as the Deputy Chair. The Committee will continue to meet monthly.

# Clinical Network Monthly Highlight

#### Musculoskeletal, Integumentary and Trauma (MIT) Network

The development of the new Clinical Services Plan (CSP) 2023-2028 will further inform the strategic direction for the Network, aligning with the NSLHD Strategic Plan 2022 – 2027.

In 2023 the Network will continue to address the impact of COVID-19 on planned elective surgery. This includes exploring the potential redistribution of orthopaedic surgery using the existing available infrastructure at NSLHD.

The Network also aim to further develop its governance structures and provide further opportunities for oversight of the CSP priorities and clinical strategic initiatives. This will also allow for increased monitoring of clinical safety and quality indicators.

A recent study was published by Stanford University that identified the top 2% of researchers in the world across individual fields. 15 researchers from the Kolling Institute were highlighted in the study, of which a significant number are part of the MIT Network.

## **Integrated Care**

#### **Direct NSW Ambulance referrals:**

Work is ongoing to enable a greater number of NSW Ambulance referrals to key NSLHD services, including:

- Aged Care Rapid Response
- Hospital in the Home
- Virtual Care Service
- Palliative Care
- Mental Health
- Community Nursing

A NSW Ambulance phone and triage line will soon be available in the NSLHD Virtual Care Service. This will provide NSW Ambulance with a single point of contact for NSLHD services, and the opportunity to seek advice from a Virtual Care Service clinician.

# **Service Updates**

## Mental Health, Drug & Alcohol (MHDA)

The new Hornsby Ku-Ring-Gai Hospital Psychiatric Emergency Care Centre opened on 14th February 2023. The purpose-designed space has a capacity of 6 beds and will provide care and treatment for patients requiring emergency mental health admissions.

# Primary & Community Health (PACH)

The PACH Recognition and Excellence Awards for 2022 were recently held, with 52 staff members in attendance for the celebration. The winners of each category were invited to the NSLHD Exceptional People Awards event in March 2023.

#### Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Service

The NSLHD Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Service attended the launch of the Catholic Care Diocese of Broken Bay, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Playgroup Opening held at Waitara Family Centre. The playgroup was opened following extensive community consultation and yarning circles.

The playgroup will run on a weekly basis and provides an environment for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and their families to engage in play and cultural activities.

The NSLHD Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Service staff recently attended the 2023 Stepping Up forum. The forum provided networking opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander staff members across NSW.

## **Counter Disaster**

Emergency Procedures training has been provided to staff at the new Adolescent and Young Adult Hospice. Additionally, a number of tabletop exercises have been held to inform the strategies and procedures in clinical services, as per the Business Continuity Management policy directive from the Ministry.

# **Our Staff**

### People and Culture

#### Flexible Working: Listen & Learn Focus Groups

A number of focus group sessions were held in February exploring flexible work practices for NSLHD staff members. Dedicated sessions were held for specific cohorts of workers, including frontline workers, managers, and administrative staff. The Human Resource Business Partner team is currently working through the gathered insights from these sessions and planning for next steps.

#### International Women's Day – 8 March

International Women's Day will be on 8 March with the theme for 2023 being Embrace Equity. On the day, there will be opportunities for all NSLHD hospitals and services to celebrate, connect, acknowledge, and understand the ways we can all embrace equity in the workplace.

#### NSLHD LGBTIQ+ Health Symposium 2023

The NSLHD People and Culture directorate are providing support to the NSLHD LGBTIQ+ Network with all aspects of the inaugural NSLHD LGBTIQ+ Health Symposium, which will be held on 10 March 2023. The symposium will incorporate a hybrid model of delivery to include face to face and digital for staff across NSLHD and from other affiliated organisations.

#### Thrive Leadership Development Program

The newly branded THRIVE leadership development program is a multi-disciplinary, purposebuilt program designed around the capabilities that leaders need to flourish and achieve team success. The first cohort of the program will commence in March 2023.

#### 2023 Healthcare Worker Influenza Vaccination Program

Planning is underway for the Annual 'Fluvax' Program for 2023. It is expected that the vaccine will be available from mid-April and throughout May in 2023. The influenza vaccination is provided free to all NSW Health staff members.

# Nursing and Midwifery

#### **Clinical Practice, Quality & Safety Team**

Hospital Acquired Complications (HACs) - Education for Nurses and Midwives A number of online modules have been identified which are relevant to HACs. An awareness campaign is in development to encourage NSLHD nurses and midwives to complete the training. This aims to improve Hospital Acquired Complications across NSLHD hospitals and services.

#### Patient Access and Logistic Service (PALS)

PALS has undertaken a business analysis in partnership with the NSLHD Information Communications and Technology team. The aim of the analysis is to develop and enhance PALS business and workflow practices in a digitally enabled way, reducing process inefficiency and waste, whilst maximising value from existing resources to increase service and personnel productivity.

PALS has partnered with the Nursing and Midwifery Directorate and Executive Director Operations to commence a review and redesign of the NSLHD Patient Flow Teleconference. The aim of this work is to enhance stakeholder engagement and NSLHD governance to positively impact patient flow and ensure priority outputs are actioned.

#### Nursing and Midwifery Research and Education

There are 15 research studies underway in numerous nursing disciplines including emergency and mental health. Research studies are also being conducted around cognitive bias, condition, predictors of emergency admission, impact of covid and nurse-initiated guidelines.

#### Nursing and Midwifery Workforce Team

#### Transitional Enrolled Nurses

Interviews were held in late February 2023, with reference checks underway for suitable candidates. The new cohort will commence on 27 March 2023.

#### GradStart 2023

The first group of GradStart participants for 2023 commenced in February 2023 in the areas of midwifery, neonatal intensive care (NICU), intensive care (ICU) and peri-operative services at RNSH. The next group of GradStart participants are due to commence in March 2023.

#### **Medical Services**

Updated Junior Medical Officer (JMO) wellbeing assessment templates have been rolled out across NSLHD facilities with data being collected on a monthly basis. The NSLHD Board JMO Wellbeing Committee will reconvene on a bi-annual basis commencing in July 2023.

#### Allied Health

In partnership with the Organisational Development and Capability (ODaC) team, the Allied Health Leading Teams in the Clinical Workplace workshops returned face to face. The workshop aims to elevate allied health professionals to develop leadership skills.

NSLHD are working with the Australian Film Television and Radio School (AFTRS) to provide a tailored education and training webinar for allied health clinicians to further provide Telehealth services to patients, their families, and carers.

# **Research and Innovation**

## Service Improvement and Innovation

#### eReferrals

NSLHD is transitioning to electronic referrals for all outpatient services. 25 services in NSLHD have launched eReferrals successfully since August and November 2022. eReferrals is being made available to other services and this is expected to occur in May 2023.

eHealth plans to launch the state-wide referral management system in NSLHD later this year and this will integrate eReferrals with NSLHD systems.

# Research

A number of cancer researchers from NSLHD have been profiled as belonging to the global top 2% researchers in an international study led by Stanford University, USA. # Information, Communication & Technology (ICT)

#### **Network Strategy**

The State Health Grade Enterprise Network (HGEN) initiative aims to ensure a fit-for-purpose and regularly maintained network campus infrastructure which connects all facilities and care settings, within each campus.

All Health entities will be required to adhere to State-wide standards for network infrastructure, design and purchase of network infrastructure, along with associated managed services from a State-wide panel of providers.

#### **Cyber Security**

The team is continuing to work with eHealth NSW to ensure alignment of local initiatives with the state-wide programs including the Essential Eight maturity uplift.

A program facilitated by Cyber Security NSW and NSLHD Counter Disaster Unit was recently held. The program was well attended by NSLHD Executive staff, as well as NSLHD subject matter experts and ICT response teams.
